BIO

Joyce Moseley (b. 1954) explores unique imagery from her day-to-day life – churches, quilts, and plates of food are recurring themes that appear in different configurations. Recently Joyce has developed an interest in calligraphy ink and pen, which has given her drawn line a dynamic new variation in flow and line weight. She draws inspiration from art history books as well as her family and friends. This exhibition of drawings and paintings features portraits of people and animals, as well as semi-narrative interior scenes.

Joyce was born January 29th, 1954, in Philadelphia, PA, where she continues to live with her family. She began making artwork about eleven years ago at Oasis, an art studio in Philadelphia. For the past seven years she has worked at the Center for Creative Works. Aside from her drawing and painting work, Joyce creates unique portraits of seated figures in wood, sculptures in ceramic, woodblock prints on fabric, and embroidered textiles. Joyce has exhibited at the Woodmere Museum, University City Arts League, and Haverford College. Her daughter, Lillian, is also an artist at CCW.
